The economic gap within the city unfortunately has grown significantly over time, and it further widened during the bleak years that were severely impacted by the COVID-19 shutdowns. By the first quarter of last year, more than 1.3 million individuals were grappling with poverty in Hong Kong, including over 200,000 children under 18 that were living below the property threshold, according to the Hong Kong Government's own statistics. Both the youngsters and their Guardians encounter a myriad of adversities in their daily lives.

Over 12 years ago, my Co-Founder Bruce Stinson and I established the first HUB Hong Kong with a vision to offer the less fortunate children of Hong Kong a chance to realise their full potential in life, and to break out of the cycle of poverty. Situated in Cheung Sha Wan, The HUB stands as a crucial sanctuary for underprivileged children in Hong Kong.

As we proclaim at The HUB – Happy Space for Young Minds. Our aim is to provide these children with multiple avenues in life recognising the future of society rest in the hands of the children. The Center has assisted thousands of children in accessing educational, artistic, athletic, and musical opportunities, broadening their horizons in ways that they might not otherwise have encountered. We regularly offer excursions to the children and their families, to give them access to leisure activities that they could not otherwise afford. We also provide counselling services for both the children and their parents, and The HUB also provides exposure to career opportunities.



During the period of July 2023 to June 2024, the HUB Children and Youth Centre delivered a total of 190 programs, engaging with a wide range of beneficiaries and communities. The center's services have had a significant impact, with a total of 12,121 person-times benefiting from the programs offered.

These services not only catered to the educational and developmental needs of children and youth but also aimed to foster a sense of community, well-being, and enrichment. The HUB Children and Youth Centre's commitment to providing a diverse range of programs reflects its dedication to nurturing the holistic growth of its beneficiaries and creating a positive impact on the lives of those it serves.

The breakdown of services provided by the HUB Children and Youth Centre during this period includes:

- Sports Activities
- Academic Programs
- Other Programs
- Outings/One-off Events
- Supplies Distribution
- Music Classes
- Parental Engagement
- Personal Development



Sports Activities: 51 programs were organized to promote physical fitness and well-being through sports. A total 432 sessions, benefiting 3,097 person-times





Academic Programs: 36 programs were dedicated to academic support, aiding children in their educational journey. A total 501 sessions, benefiting 4,212 persontimes





Other Programs (e.g., art, cooking): 29 programs offered diverse activities to cater to varied interests and talents. A total 193 sessions, benefiting 1,268 persontimes





Outings/One-off Events: 27 sessions provided opportunities for children to explore the world beyond the center. A total benefiting 791 person-times





Supplies Distribution: 19 sessions involved distributing essential supplies to support families in need. A total benefiting 1,216 families





Music Classes: 17 programs were conducted to foster musical talents and appreciation among the youth. A total 165 sessions, benefiting 848 person-times





Parental Engagement: 8 programs focused on involving parents in the development and growth of their children. A total 64 sessions, benefiting 534 person-times






Personal Development: 3 programs were dedicated to personal growth and skills enhancement. A total 28 sessions, benefiting 155 person-times






Financials
